The story about "Eternity in their hearts"

A missionary, some years back, named Don Richardson wrote of his experiences in a tribal situation that seemed impossible. The people were dangerous to outsiders and he was able to live among them only because he could gain access to tools and other items valued by the villagers. Even worse, they considered treachery a virtue, so when Richardson finally learned their language well enough to tell them the story of Jesus, they celebrated not the Savior, but Judas the betrayer. The three years serving Jesus was, they felt, a wonderful prelude to turning Him over to the Roman authorities. Richardson despaired of ever winning any of these people to Christ.

The War

Then followed a terrible episode with a wonderful ending. The tribe went to war with another tribe, that eventually resulted in a negotiated peace. The negotiations were concluded with a ceremony in which an infant from one tribe was presented to the other as a guarantee that the terms of the peace would be kept. This was the "peace child". As long as the peace child was alive, the two tribes would never go to war against each other.

The Peace Child

Richardson saw his opportunity, and explained to his people that Jesus is the great "peace child" between people and Almighty God. Jesus was the way to God in peace, and this presentation of the Gospel the people understood and a church was born in this tribe. It's been said that in every heart of every culture there is a yearning for eternity, something with which the Gospel can relate. It is my prayer that missionaries all over the world will find the "eternity in the heart" of the people they serve, and that people in Marshalltown who presently have no interest in Jesus will find that same yearning in themselves. Your help is needed on Saturday, Jan 11th at 10 am to take down the Christmas decorations. Come and help...won't take long with many hands. Thank you!


MISSIONS & BENEVOLENCE
