


# Pilgrim's Progress February 2020

## Theme for the sermons of the month: Making the Most of Life

It has been said that life is God's gift to us, what we do with that life is our gift to God. I think that there is some truth to that. In one of His many parables, the Lord Jesus spoke of three servants to

whom a wealthy man entrusted cash for investment. The first two followed suit and invested the money and made a profit, and were both rewarded. The third, considering his employer to be a hard man who took what did not belong to him, took the cash and buried it in a safe place. He was able to return the cash to his employer upon his return. The employer, probably insulted, takes the money away from that last servant and gives it to the one who did the best job of investing, and the last servant was punished. In the actual parable, Jesus uses "talents", bars of precious metal and what the "talents' actually represent is a matter of debate. I think that was deliberate. The "talents" could be the spiritual gifts bestowed upon the church by the Holy Spirit, it could be the gospel, which is the power of God for salvation (Romans 1:16), or it could be our lives and what we do with it. I do not think that makes the most of our lives involves riches or fame. It involves learning what it means to be led by the Holy Spirit, or to be pleasing to the Lord, or to know Him better, or to be made more like Him. It is service and prayer, and unconditional love. It is an uncounted accumulation of gracious acts of service borne out of heart that is grateful for a salvation made only of grace. That is the theme of our sermons this month.

#### Ash Wednesday February 26 7:00 p.m.

We begin Lent with worship in song, reflection and the Imposition of Ashes the last Wednesday of the month in the Sanctuary. By participating in this we confront our mortality (which is health if we don't overdo it) and remember that Jesus, the eternal Son of God, chose to die a mortal death for the sins of the world. This is a good opportunity to grow spiritually and to remember the suffering of our Savior. Hope to see you there. Schedule of morning breakfast meetings for Lent follows on page 2.
