A couple of thoughts about October, including the Sacrament of Holy Communion again taking place on Facebook at 2:00 p.m. on October 4. While I look forward to the day when we will have Communion all together again in person, this is probably the safest way to continue the tradition of having Communion on the first

Sunday of the month.

October's sermons will focus on the Gospel of Matthew, the most Jewish of the Gospels. Matthew emphasizes Jesus as the one who has fulfilled the Law and the Gospel is heavily influenced (one could argue that the whole New Testament is heavily influenced by the Old Testament) by the Old Testament. One example is the image of the church being a vine, or that Jesus is like a vine and the church make up the branches, and the Father is the vinedresser (this is overtly used in John 15) but it also undergirds the passage in Matthew 21:33-46. Isaiah 5:1-7 uses the image of a vine and a vineyard is a telling symbol of Israel, and it's taken to apply to the whole people of God. In the days of Jesus, He, His disciples and the religious leaders of the day would have known immediately that when Jesus told a story about a vineyard, that it applied to Israel and God's people. It's a great image of how we are connected together, and dependent upon the Lord. As Fall continues, may you be blessed and encouraged even as we come to the last few months of this challenging year.

Her hands-on training included kid's camps, inner city ministry, missions, ministry to the poor, and crusades around the world. Barbara was part of the staff at the Calvary Campground in Ashland, Virginia for over 20 years. Her ministry experience is wide and varied, from living in Hong Kong to minister in Asia, to living in Jerusalem, to being on staff at a street mission in San Diego, Ca to minister to the needs of the homeless during the beginning of the AIDS outbreak.

She has ministered in 55 nations, has been a missionary, an evangelist, and pastor. She has spent the last few years traveling the U.S. and the world over conducting worship seminars, retreats, and conferences, leading missions trips, offering prayer and counseling, and seeing thousands healed and set free inside and out, equipping lives for the Glory of God.

A widow for 8 years, Barbara remarried! She lives in Iowa with her husband, Jeff. She is the joyful mother of 4 and grandmother of 2! Together she and Jeff have 8 children and 10 grandkids!

News from Missions and Benevolence:

FCC Mission and Benevolence Committee Responds to Local and International Needs

COVID-19 has created havoc across the world. Challenges in meeting public health and basic needs when shelter-in-place or quarantines are imposed is hard enough in the United States, let alone third world countries. My Kinsman Ministries was "in the trenches" in Sierra Leone amping up their community health engagements, helping indigent citizens to develop skills and acquire basic needs to foster financial independence while also sharing the Word of God – seeding hope for better times. FCC Missions and Benevolence Committee was grateful to be able to continue supporting this industrious mission with a \$5000 gift in May 2020.

Close at home, the committee has issued two checks to our local Salvation Army. One -\$2165, was sent in April 2020 to assist them in their efforts to fill financial gaps feeding families and maintaining utilities in many Marshalltown homes created by work layoffs associated with COVID-19 and the derecho. A follow up check for \$500 was sent in September 2020 expressly to help them resupply Sals Cupboard – a food distribution service for those in deep financial straits. Marshalltown Emergency Food received the same amount to resupply their also depleted inventory.

You all should know that at least two NACCC churches contacted Pastor Dan and/or Kim Schryver about how best to help after the derecho. Pastor Dan is managing a donation from the National Assoc. to support local victims of the derecho in conjunction with Salvation Army and MICA. We are not alone; our association cares about our welfare here in Marshalltown!

Guzman Family Ministries received an annual donation of \$3000 (3/2020) to help meet the needs of ongoing efforts to reach children in VBS and weekly Bible Schools shantytowns and innercity Monterrey. In support of their valuable work, Marshalltown Christian School received a \$5000 gift in May 2020.

Again, the committee thanks those who donated their personal resources – time, talent, material, and dollars, to the FCC Mask Project. It pleases us greatly to see faces we love in our church pews, socially distancing, with masks on (many of which we recognize as FCC "homemade") and sharing in worship with us. Because masks are so readily accessible in the public, we kindly ask that you resupply yourselves with new masks, if new ones are needed. A few of us will continue to make masks available as we access new material and find the time to sew.

The committee is in the process of researching MANY extremely important ways to help others in the U.S. and the world following multiple hurricanes and devastating fires, among other catastrophes. We appreciate the breadth and depth of needs and pray for discernment on how best this church can provide loving relief through Christian hands.

Finally, Jonna Wagar is again in charge of our Christmas outreach. Our intention was to again support the Salvation Army Toys for Tots program, but what this will look like in 2020 under COVID restrictions is still unclear. Please, watch the newsletter for more information about how our church might be physical, emotional and financial supports to others this Christmas.

Know that we are praying for your personal health and safety and our church as well!
