The Greatness of God

The focus of the sermons for this month is the greatness of God, who does not think, nor act like we expect. He told the Prophet Isaiah as much (Isaiah 55:9) and in the New Testament (1 Corinthians 2:9) He mentions that His great thoughts include the plans He has for the followers of Jesus. Upon reflection of

the greatness of God demonstrated at Christmas and the birth of the Lord Jesus, two thoughts came to mind:

The Incarnation

The Incarnation is one of the unique features of Christianity, in that God created, and then joined the Creation. In His birth Jesus, the eternal Son of God, entered humanity and never divested Himself of that humanity. When He rose from the dead and ultimately ascended into heaven it was as a person fully divine and fully human at the same time. He is still the same today, seated at the right hand of God the Father

The Value of Family and Everyday Life

The teaching, preaching and miracles of Jesus, to our knowledge, all took place in the last three years of His life. All that came before was, as far as we can tell, spent with family and living everyday life. Only His encounter with the teachers in the Temple as a twelve year old boy is recorded in Scripture, but I think that it is safe to assume that he worked in the family business with His father, spent a lot of time with His brothers and sisters (the author of the book of James was one of them) and looked after His mother. It speaks volumes of the value God places on what we often take for granted. Have a Merry Christmas, and cherish your family even if you can't be near them this holiday season. Pastor Dan

2021 NACCC ANNUAL MEETING & CONFERENCE AND 2021 NAPF – HOPE CONFERENCE CANCEL IN-PERSON MEETING

November 17, 2020

Since last winter, our lives and our plans have been affected by the pandemic and its spread. As we look into the immediate future, that continues to be true.

On November 9, 2020, the Board of Directors of the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches voted unanimously not to hold its 2021 Annual Meeting & Conference scheduled for Spokane, WA in person, but, instead, to hold a virtual only meeting. At this point, specific details for the meeting are being formulated and will be communicated as they are finalized. The vote by the Board of Directors also cancelled the in-person NAPF and HOPE gatherings.

This decision was made in order to safeguard the health and well-being of our delegates, our young people, and their families.
