Acts 1:9-11

"Now when He had spoken these things, while they watched, He was taken up, and a cloud received Him out of their sight. And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel, who also said, 'Mem of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? Theis same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven."

After Jesus rose from the dead, He spent some time with His disciples and then ascended into heaven. As recorded in Acts above, Jesus promised the presence of the Holy Spirit just before He left and gave them the strongest missionary statement short of the Great Commission in Matthew 28 when He told them that they would be His witnesses locally and "to the ends of the earth". In the meantime, they had to wait. Sometimes we must wait and be patient, for God has a timing that is different than our expectations. Waiting is not wasting, however, and those times where we wait to grow or to experience God in a new and profound way can be helpful times of preparation. Be patient if you are in a season in which you must wait for God to answer prayer. He will, in His own time.





April 2020 worship services were ripe with the Holy Spirit. Our celebrations during Holy Week were especially touching. The Renewal Listening Team (RLT) felt privileged to share *The Story of Who We Are* draft for the first time during the Easter Morning Services. Thank you for being there.

Over 40 interviews were conducted in February and March of 2022 by the RLT. We are so grateful to the individuals, couples and small groups who took the time to share their perceptions of who we are as a community of faith today in the second of three phases of interviews in our church renewal process. If you have not participated in this phase, we would welcome you to do so. Contact Miriam Bryant by phoning or texting (515) 771-5930 to request an interview. She will arrange for a member of the Listening Team to set up a 30-minute visit to conduct the interview at a time and place convenient to you.

In this newsletter is our draft of *The Story of Who We Are....* It as a living document – one open for improvement. We invite each of you to reread the summary and consider the following questions:

- What strikes you in our narrative? What rings true? What is missing?
- Do you see your own story and the story of your family as a part of FCC Marshalltown in this summary?
- Where do we see God active in our story?
- How does this summary help you prepare to see our future connected with God's story?

The RLT looks forward to hearing if and how this summary resonates with you. During regular board and committee meetings, we suggest you establish some reflection time as a part of the May agenda. Identify what strikes you in this summary, and what should be high-lighted, but presently is not. Someone from the RLT will take notes and use them to improve the narrative. Watch for other gatherings in which you can share YOUR thoughts. Everyone should also feel free to provide constructive response to the all church e-mail that presented the summary.

The last gathering at which we will consider how to improve *The Story of Who We Are* will be on Saturday, May 21, 2022 during the **Planting For The Future Conference.** A poster for the conference is also in this newsletter. Others are displayed throughout the church. All who want to participate in the future visioning for First Congregational Church are invited between 9:30 am – 2:00 pm to the church. Coffee and muffins will be available in the morning and lunch will be provided. In addition to reflection time on our Cycle II Summary, we will worship together and begin to dream together under the guidance of our professional consultants. Cycle II Interview Highlights and Summary as of Easter, April 17, 2022

# The stories of who we are as a congregation are full of challenge, hope, and rich glimpses of God's movement among us.

**As a People:** We are a congregation of mostly 50+ year olds with a few younger members and families. Many attest to this congregation as a loving, warm and welcoming congregation. We are grateful for the talents, engagement, and commitment from members in our community of faith.

#### **What We've Come to Value:**

#### Our Relationships...

with God - We are becoming a household deeper grounded in God. We value sermons, teaching and music that are biblically-based. We are learning that our personal differences, doubts, and joys are gifts that broaden our understandings as we seek to understand God's will.
 with One Another - We are growing into an even more loving church family that welcomes new people. Whenever possible, face-to-face gatherings to worship, learn, do benevolent works and socialize together are much preferred over digital ways to strengthen our ties with one another.
 with Our Community and the World - We are discovering the importance of being a missional church.

#### Growing as Disciples

Many of us said, "We feel called" to worship and engage at FCC. We feel called to strengthen: 1) ourselves as students and modelers of Christ at church and in everyday life; 2) others through joy-filled benevolence and works in God's name and by sharing God's word as the Holy spirit empowers us to do so. We are hungry for more opportunities to learn together, worship together, fellowship together and endeavor to practice the ways of Kingdom Living described in scripture.

#### Participating in Decision-Making

We recognize the importance of the "Congregational Way" of church governance.

#### Communicating with Each Other

Both digital and in print media have strengthened our engagement with one another. We have discovered face-to-face interaction to be the most effective way for us to connect. When face-to-face is not possible, we have learned due to the pandemic, that technology can be an effective way to maintain contact with each other.

**What God is Doing:** We are excited about the impact and missional potential of our youth ministry. It has a significant influence on many un-churched children providing a lifetime of affirmation of their worth to God and to us. God is using our youth ministry to model positive family interaction for children who do not experience such relations in their own homes. It is so good to see the continued commitment among us as people generously sharing their talents, time, and financial support. We are stimulated by scripturally focused sermons with meaningful understandable applications. We believe in God's capacity to transform us individually and as a congregation making us more like Christ. The pandemic has taught us that challenges and change can strengthen us as a congregation.

<u>What Draws Us Together:</u> God has blessed us. We appreciate one another and our shared values; family ties - sometimes generations-long; the history of Congregationalism, and opportunities for engagement in church life and work that bring purpose, joy and fellowship.

**We Wonder:** How do we make God and our church more relevant to the people of this time, and especially this community? How do we make worship personally meaningful to a diverse congregation? How do we balance the positive potential of "digital church" with the identified advantage of face-to-face engagement to strengthen relationships and communication?

So we learn of a gracious host, expecting to enjoy the presence of his friends at a banquet, a bidding to dine was answered with excuses. For no good sound reason was the invitation rejected – just good old easy out excuse.

As in Luke, it tells us if an excuse is offered, that probably ends future invitations. Or as we might say now "I was turned down once, there may never be another opportunity". My church has asked me to participate, should I offer an excuse or do its bidding to the best of my ability.

We are at the happiest when we give of ourselves. Thus when asked to do something, - let us stop and think: - we would have not been asked unless the individual believed we were qualified and capable in doing the task – so let us give of our tome and talents and say YES.

**Prayer:** "Lord, give us the courage and fortitude to "think positive" and give of our talents regardless of how limited." Amen.
