


Pilgrim's Progress

FCC Proudly Continues Support of Marshalltown Christian Schools (MCS)

MCS Mission: To glorify God through biblical, Christ-centered education, providing academic excellence and preparing students for service and leadership.

Founded in 2006 the school was housed in borrowed church facilities during the week until 2020 when MCS moved into its own facility – a building financed through contributions from many individuals and churches across the area. All the debt from that capital investment has been paid off. It is a fully accredited private school.

To date, 202 students have been served. About 50 – 60 students have attended MCS during each term of recent school years. It is MCS leadership's goal to move that annual attendance in the next few years to the maximum capacity of 96 students per school year.

Students are served from "Begindergarten" through 8th grade. Begindergarten is a transitional option for youngsters who need a bit more time after pre-school preparations and before kindergarten to mature in their focus, discipline, physical coordination and socialization. Parents can elect either full or half-day Begindergarten; the same is true for kindergarten. There is also certified before and after school care for enrollees.

Children who attend are from at least 15 different church backgrounds and have included Hispanic/Latino and Southeast Asian students. Extracurricular activities provided at the school include piano lessons and enrichment science experiences. Fifth to eighth grade students can dually enroll in Marshalltown Community School District which affords them access to all extracurricular and enrichment opportunities available through the public schools.

One of the great advantages of MCS is the small class sizes. Average student to teacher ratio is 10: 1. Typically, two grade levels meet in the same room at the same time. This enables great flexibility in provision of remedial and/or enriched curriculums in any subject as students can easily join older or younger students within the classroom or next door.

One of the great challenges for parents who would like to consider MCS is the financial cost. Tuition per child per year is \$5,400. Scholarships are available on a sliding scale of need and can be a make-or-break factor in deciding whether or not to send a child (or especially children in one family) to this private school. It is here where the FCC Missions and Benevolence Committee has decided to earmark our church's donation of \$5000 to MCS as of June 2022. Special scholarship funds are set aside for children of Pastors, Associate Pastors and Youth Leaders.

MCS has an informative website: mcsiowa.org. Bethany Wirin is the School Administrator. She can be reached through the website or by calling (641) 753-8824. We are grateful to Bethany and MCS Board Member, Matt Hoven, for attending the regular Missions and Benevolence Meeting in May 2022 to update us on MCS achievements and aspirations. They have offered to update the entire congregation sometime soon in a brief address during a regular 10:30 am Worship Service sometime soon.
