The Women's Ministry at First Congregational Church is ready to resume. As announced in July, our August 15 meeting included choosing a name and a meeting time. "Women's Ministry" was chosen to identify the group. The name defines the purpose.

Meetings are scheduled for the first Monday of the month. Our <u>first large group meeting</u> is **October 3 at 5:30 p.m.** in the Fellowship Hall. There will be prayer, light refreshments, fellowship time, and a short business meeting to answer questions and establish direction for future meetings. We will be adding a program chair and prayer leader to our planning team.

Jane Vermulm has graciously agreed to lead our Women's Ministry <u>Bible study opportunity</u> which will be offered the second and fourth Mondays of the month beginning **Monday September 12 at 5:30 p.m.** in the library. Our first study will be <u>Women of God:</u>

<u>Character Studies of Women in the Bible</u>. It is a Lifeway study. Jane has ordered materials which will be available on the 12th. Thank you, Jane!

Discussions about restarting a women's ministry in our church have carried on for about 8+ months. Our efforts began with sharing a meal together... which led to replanning the Fellowship Hall table decorations... which led to cleaning out the big closet downstairs...and...here we are!

We arrived at the conclusion that we believe a healthy church includes an active women's ministry where friends gather to pray, fellowship, serve, and grow in ways that strengthen our family of God.

Researching the way others cover women's ministry led us to Cyndee Ownbey who says, "A profitable ministry is grounded in God's Word and grows in the context of God's people aiming for the glory of Christ." She shared four "pillars" supporting the need for a women's ministry in a healthy church.

- 1. Study -- God's Word.
 - 2 Timothy 3:16
- 2. Service -- to others and use of special gifts endowed by the Lord.

1Peter 4:10

3. Need for a safe place to find Biblically sound support.

Ecclesiastes 4:10

4. Social -- regular meetings with other believers. Hebrews 10:25

We don't have to model after anyone else, but we DO need to meet the needs of those we want to serve. Our quest to define needs continued.

Our team conducted a survey to determine the needs and the support for a women's ministry within the congregation. Each potential group participant has unique needs and thoughts. God's direction helps us meet those needs and build/maintain precious bonds with each other.

The questions were:

- 1. Are you interested in participating in a women's group? Why or why not?
- 2. What purpose for the group would you support?
- 3. When would you like the meetings scheduled? How often?
- 4. What activities would you enjoy?
- 5. Additional thought/comments....

The results were tallied and seemed to fall in line with the "pillars" outlined above. If you would like to share your thoughts on the above questions, please do so! It has been challenging to secure input from the very people we want to serve.

Our Women's Ministry possibilities are endless! One person pointed out that our women's group needs to look and proceed differently from the other secular groups in which we participate.

We would like to explore ways to include our friends who do not have access to joining us at 5:30 at the church.

We are eager to move beyond the planning stage to be a functioning women's ministry determined to continue to worship and honor God as we move forward in a new format. Our goal is to use this opportunity to grow together. This is NOT only <u>our group</u>. It is <u>God's</u> group. We lift our purpose and growth to the Lord for His blessing and guidance. Without the Lord's direction, we cannot be effective in our ministry.

"Binding the Graciousness of God to the Community's Urgent Action" Submitted by: Kim Schryver, Chair RCT

As Pastor Dan winds down our Bible Study "A People of Salt and Light" we are taking a deeper dive into the Lord's Prayer (Matthew 6:1-18). We are discussing practical issues in Kingdom living that the prayer addresses. We are also considering: "How does the Lord's Prayer inform what the priorities of church are to be? How does it affirm or challenge our church's priorities?" The narrative of our present Bible study closes with the following thoughts, abridged and slightly paraphrased for this newsletter:

The Lord's Prayer provides a vision for the life of faith of the Christian community with special focus on: the holiness of God's name, His gracious will in human affairs and in provision of needs for abundant life together. It challenges the community of faith to respond by binding the graciousness of God to the community's urgent action to authentically witness and to ease others' burdens.

It is a meaningful exercise to pray the prayer not only from our individual perspectives, but also with a *focus on the congregate implications of our prayer* together. It is right in line with the kind of preparation to which we as a congregation need to commit to prepare our hearts and minds to imagine our future together.

Ray Schulte reminded the RCT at our last meeting that renewal is FIRST asking us to consider... In this time and this place, **what is God calling us** as a body of believers **to BE** not just do? (That primary emphasis is helped along greatly by meditation on the Lord's Prayer and by focus on the purposes for church highlighted in the June RCT newsletter article.) In answering this big question, we seek to see our role within God's larger story. What is God doing? What is my role – personally and as an FCC congregant, in the larger divine story of God's activities in the world?

In our next installment, we'll share the questions planned for Cycle III Interviews "What Is God Calling Us to Be?" We pray that God will help us to open the eyes of our hearts to discern our roles. Members of the Listening Team will conduct the interviews in September. Tentatively mark you calendars for an all-church renewal celebration the weekend of Oct. 23, 2022, wherein our coaches will help us: prepare our final summary from the Cycle III Interview responses, pray with, unpack, and take ownership of how God's gift of Vision calls us into the future corporately and personally – "Living into a Faithful Future: Turning Vision into Action."
