

Organ Repair/Rebuild

Thanks to the very generous Al Packer Memorial we were able to go forward with the organ repair/rebuild project. The contract was signed and a down payment submitted to Levsen Organ Company guaranteeing work will begin sometime in the 2nd quarter of 2023. Pat Anderson and Gary Heggen are managing the rebuild. Mike Woltjer from the Trustees is managing the in-house construction. The rebuild begins with the removal of hundreds of pipes by Levsen personnel and sent to the factory for repair/replace and cleaning. After pipe removal, the organ chambers reconstruction will begin and the organ console sent out for rebuild and updated to solid state. During this time the first service will meet in the Chapel while the 2nd service will meet in the Fellowship Hall. The process is expected to take 3-4 months, depending on the in-house construction. When all is complete we plan to have a special service with guest organist to dedicate the organ. As we get closer and can firm up the dates/activities we will give updates in the monthly church newsletter.



The House of Compassion Supply Closet is in need of supplies, especially laundry detergent, dish soap and shampoo for those that can help!






DOG's (Depend on God)—Tuesdays from 5-6:30pm in the Fellowship Hall for Preschool-5th grade with a meal provided.

Forging A Renewed Identify

Thank you to the many many individuals, families and groups that have invested their time with Listening Team members to share their imaginings in the third and final interviews conducted for renewal efforts. Thirty-seven Interviews were conducted engaging 60 people in September and early October 2022. Your commitment thus far to and input in the process of creating our story - who we were, are, and are called to be, has been a joy. Just meeting together face to face with meaningful conversation has been worth the effort and for many of us, has given us recharged spirit and purpose in this body of believers.

Thank you too to our coaches: Ray Schulte – Director, Center for Parish Development; Pastor Shawn Stapleton – NACCC Liaison to CPD & FCC; Pastor Steve Slagel – Design Group International and Center for Parish Development. The method they have taught us started to really come together at FCC's Faithful Future Conference. Interview Summaries enabled participants to discover common themes, experiences and aspirations that link treasured characteristics from the past, with valued experiences in the now and hopes for the future. These are elements of a story we are writing together – the story of a hope-filled and heart-for-God future using the "Storyboarding" technique.

And finally, thanks from the bottom of our hearts to the 42 committed people of this congregation who were engaged in our church visioning effort at the Faithful Future Conference Friday, Oct. 21 – Sunday, Oct.23, 2022. After our coaches introduced us to "Storyboarding," it was so exciting to see the light bulbs ignite with growing understanding of what the 18-mos of renewal is leading to for FCC. Those interview responses in aggregate give us a clear picture of Spirit-filled motive forces we share in common. From this emerging picture of FCC we can make rational decisions on what we might do to pursue moving our vision into action.

Shawn Stapleton said, "God is like a parent taking a child to a playground, everything is permissible at the playground – slide, swings, monkey-bars, as long as you stay in the playground." We just need to get together on what we as a body of believers see as our identity now, and that will help define our playground of action-oriented priorities for the next few years.

This is what you said about our identify going forward.


