The Spiritual Discipline of Prayer

This month we consider prayer, one of the most fundamental of spiritual disciplines. It is prayer and careful reading of Scripture that forms the basis for

all the other disciplines. One the face of it, prayer can seem rather silly. We have a conversation, using thought most of the time, with a Being that we cannot experience with our five senses under ordinary circumstances. Yet it is absolutely vital. Martin Luther once said, "As it is the business of tailors to make clothes and of cobblers to mend shoes, so it is the business of Christians to pray."

ACTS

"ACTS" as an acronym for prayer came, it is said, from the great reformer, whose barber asked him for advice on prayer. Luther said to start with "adoration"-praise-simply telling God who He is in all His greatness. "C" stands for confession, both confession of sin and an acknowledgement that we are who the Bible says we are, not what we think we are or what other people say we are. "T" stands for "thanksgiving." "S" is for supplication-asking for ourselves and other.

Meditation

There is also a means of prayer that leads to the consideration of Scripture. It goes both ways; from prayer to Scripture and from Scripture to prayer. It is meditation. This type of meditation is reading a passage over and again, pondering it, attending to how the passage makes you feel, praying about what the passage says, and say to you. Meditation connects the two essential disciplines.

Prayer can take place at a planned, focused period of time in which you do nothing but pray, and prayer can also be an ongoing conversation you have with the Lord in the back of your mind as you go about your duties for the day. As much as possible, do both. Prayer is a vital was of seeking the Presence of God, and the most practical definition I know of faith is the conviction that God exists and that He rewards those who seek Him. Prayer is the way of seeking.


