From the Pastor's Desk

Colossians 3:1-4

The Theme of Death in Resurrection

The highest day of the Christian year is Resurrection Sunday, also known as Easter. In it we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus and the promise of resurrection for all who follow Him. It is not the same as resuscitation. That is what happened with Lazarus, and unfortunately, he later had to die again. Old church tradition says that he was martyred for his faith in Christ and for his testimony. In resurrection, the person resurrected lives never to die again. Death and decay in all its forms has no power over someone who was resurrected.

Because of Resurrection, there are certain "members' that we are put to death, and they are found if we read further in Colossians, chapter 3. They are any number of behaviors that are commonplace in the human condition but are also subject to the wrath of God. We are to look upon those behaviors as if we are simply not part of that world anymore, even though we think and sometimes act as if we were. The root of such instruction is in verse 3: "For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God." Similar statements to this show up often in Scripture (consider Romans 6 and Galatians 2:20). This begs the question; in what way did we die? While we continue to breathe and act, there is something profound that takes place when a person chooses to follow Christ. There is a mindset of selfishness that is no longer relevant or appropriate but rather a worldview that is centered on Christ. The Bible depicts it, and baptism symbolizes it, not as a change of heart but a transfer from a living death to an eternal life. The better we understand that the more we will be able to consider the selfish behaviors of this world as no longer relevant to us. Resurrection means not only a new life, but also death to the old life as well.


