The Spiritual Discipline for the month of July is Stewardship, and it is a difficult yet timely issue. Consider the challenges you have faced this past month. Have you felt overloaded with responsibilities, had trouble

paying bills, keeping up with appointments, unexpected expenses or not enough rest. All of those issues involve time or money, and both time and money are spiritual disciplines. The wise use of time is Scriptural, for "now is the time of the Lord's favor" (2 Corinthians 6:2). I find if I start with even a short time of prayer before I start my day the rest seems to fall in place. It doesn't mean that I have a great day every time I pray, but somehow, I am better prepared to face the challenges of the day when I pray.

Regarding money, giving to the Lord's word is a personal decision that reflects the sovereignty of God. Several Scriptures (1 Corinthians 10:26 is just one) report that God owns everything and everyone, including us. Giving to the church and to need is a recognition of that, but it must be personal. The Apostle Paul's advice was let "each man give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver." (2 Corinthians 9:7) This is something you settle with the Lord during your time of prayer in the beginning of the day. Try it and see what happens, may God bless you in the midst of all the challenges of the day.

These adorable encouragements will be shared with our members in long-term care facilities. And they may possibly be shared with our My Kinsman Ministry friends and inspirations in Sierra Leone. Can't you imagine our nursing home members and young Africans receiving such a bright message reminding them that FCC Youth care for them! This project is evidence of real effort invested in **intergenerational relationships** within the church and **collaborative coordination between committees**. It is an investment in intrachurch and extra-church mission between working groups.

Beautiful commitment and camaraderie are evident among the participants in the Women's Fellowship and Women's Bible Study – renewed endeavors since the pandemic. These revivals of fellowship and enrichment are fostering **spiritual formation and missional projects**.

Spirit-filled music continues, but how about the revival of a choir! Even with the massive disruption caused by restoration of FCC's organ, the Music Committee has engaged a wider participation. We love how our fellow pew partners can transform a service by sharing their **inspired worship** through music in ever expanding ways.

These are a few examples of *new* initiatives that have gained some real sticking power. There are innumerable evidences of growing vigor and sense of purpose in longer-standing projects, programs and relationship-building. Our prayers are for continued growth into the people God is calling us to be.

In the coming months, a **Vision to Mission** Task Force (appointed by the Cabinet in late March) will be investing time in conversations with various committees, boards and gatherings. A survey will be conducted during these meetings. The objective will be to try to discern the heart-felt callings by God within these working, learning and fellowship groups. Task Force members will lead the exercises, record responses of those participating and help the groups identify a few common aspirations within their membership. From these results the Task Force will identify the 1-2 most common areas of interest across all groups to develop within our church at this moment in time. Our work will be submitted to the FCC Cabinet in November 2023 in the form of a recommendation of focus for our church in the next 1-2 years. The Cabinet can adopt or amend the recommendation. A Mission Statement for 2024-25 or 2024-26 will be proposed to the church membership for adoption at the Annual Meeting in 2024.

This mission statement will be an encouragement to committees to include work together with the whole membership toward a common outcome(s) that will help to make our FCC Vision – What We Believe God Is Calling Us to Be, a reality. All the work that individuals and committees are doing to further knowing God, learning to be disciples, worshipping in the Spirit, actively exercising benevolence and missions, etc. will continue in the exciting ways evident now. A focused mission statement, identified by the church membership, will impart new motive force, common purpose and cooperation to our decision making and resource investment in the next couple of years. A mission emphasis will also help us share the story of FCC more effectively with others.




