Our vision is like true north on the compass. It describes the place/the church we want to be in five to ten years. In our renewal process, we as a congregation discerned our vision and expressed it in "Key Elements of Our Story: What we Believe God is Calling Us to Be: The Future." *Seeing* the future is a critical first step, but *it will take action to achieve* that vision. There are many routes we could take to realize God's destination for us. And because no church can do everything at once, we will identify one church-wide direction (or maybe two) for starters.

That directional focus will be **our congregational mission** for the next one to two years. Choosing our congregational mission is like choosing a *road route or a tract to get to the place we believe God wants us to be.* Which direction should we take first? What should be our main directionin the next one to two years?

FCC Cabinet wants all who want to participate to join us in identifying one or two elements of our vision that are most important to the congregation as a whole to pursue. We are calling this initiative a "Vision to Mission Exercise."

This event is free and open to the public. A reception will follow in the church Fellowship Hall.


