Ash Wednesday is February 14 (it also happens to be Valentine's Day) and Ash Wednesday is the day that starts Lent, the season in which we metaphorically walk with Jesus as He travels to Jerusalem knowing

that the cross awaits Him. It's meant to be a time of reflection and awareness that this world is simply not all that there is. I thought about that for a few moments when I was playing with my grandchildren in the snow of our front yard (this was on January 22, shortly after the big freeze lifted). As I watched the girls make snow men and snow angels, I noted that the memories of them are what is going to last about this afternoon, not the car I drive or the house in which I live. This world, this life, is so temporary in the grand scheme of things and Lent gives us a healthy chance to ponder this. We take time to remember our mortality, those we love who have gone one, and what really matters in life according to God's perspective. It's the spiritual life, and by that I men a life infused and shaped by the Holy Spirit, and the impact on other lives that will matter for eternity, long after everything of this present order is ancient history. Someone asked the Lord Jesus what verse encompasses all of Scripture. He chose two, that we should love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength (Deuteronomy 6:4) and that we should love our neighbor as ourself (Leviticus 19:18). Lent is the time to think about our lives and habits as we journey to the cross with our Lord Jesus.






## **News from The Diaconate**

Purple represents repentence and solemnity. The cross is draped with a purple sash for the same reason. The sanctuary is bare of any other decorations, except the crosses in the window.

One of the definitions of a pillar is: a person or thing regarded as reliably providing essential support for something. In the New King James Version of the Bible, Paul writes in Ephesians 2:8-9, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; <u>it is</u> the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." This gift of God is the reason the receivers of this gift want to be the hands and feet of Jesus on earth. So, with these two things in mind, we would like to present the "Pillar of Faith" for February.

This person's background is interesting in that it begins in Clarion, Iowa, which is in Webster County. What makes it interesting is that a grandfather, Hezekiah Gilbert, settled just south of Clarion in Story County. Hezekiah bought land there and the town of Gilbert, Iowa was founded there. Now the southern edge of the town of Gilbert is just two miles from the northern edge of the city of Ames. Another interesting fact is that all these towns are due north of each other on highway 69.

However back to the subject which is our Pillar of Faith. She was born and baptized in the Congregational Church in Clarion. She was destined to be a Congregationalist because Hezekiah and both sides of her family were Congregationalists. When she was in 6th grade the family moved to Ames where they attended and were active in the Congregational Church. At the age of 15 her family moved to Marshalltown, where, you guessed it, they belonged to the First Congregational Church.

She was involved in youth activities as a young person and played basketball in the church league. As an adult she taught Sunday School and Bible School in the summer time. She was involved in Ladies Groups which included a Evening Ladies Group. She was on the Board of Trustees and the Diaconate. When there was a split in the Congregational Church she wrote a letter to the Association about the Congregational Way. Her comment after this statement was, "I love my Church!" She has belonged for 87 years.

When asked what activities she enjoyed doing most she said, "Teaching Sunday School but I enjoyed them all!"

When asked do you have any advice for the future of the church? She responded, "Everyone should encourage others to come to First Congregational Church, because we need to grow our church."


