


# Pilgrim's Progress

The Ascension of the Lord.

According to Sacred Scripture, Jesus remains with His disciples for some time after the Resurrection, departing from them and ascending into heaven from the Mount of Olives. We remember that event on May 9. Scripture mentions the event several times. Luke's Gospel (Luke 24:44-53) witnesses Jesus "opening their comprehension" to understand the Scriptures, and promising the arrival of the Holy Spirit in a new and special way. Then He blesses them and returns to heaven. The Book of Acts, a sequel to the Gospel of Luke, mentions that Jesus is to return the same way He left, from the Mount of Olives. In the midst of all that, I want to mention on e small detail from Luke's Gospel. When Jesus arose from heaven He was blessing His disciples. It corresponds to the promise that He remains seated at the right hand of the Father praying for us to this very day. There is a certain comfort in knowing that people are praying for you in times of trouble, or in general for that matter. I find it comforting to know that Christ prays, and prays for us, constantly. ### Pillars of Faith @ F. C. C.

For those of you who read "Pillars of Faith" in April, the person was Georgia Thomas. One of the definitions of a pillar is: a person or thing regarded as reliably providing essential support for something. In the New King James Version of the Bible, Paul writes in Ephesians 2:8-9, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; <u>it is</u> the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." This gift of God is the reason the receivers of this gift want to be the hands and feet of Jesus on earth. So, with these two things in mind, we would like to present the "Pillar of Faith" for May.

This Pillar of Faith has been a member of First Congregational Church in Marshalltown for 24 years. The maternal Grandparents of this person were members of this church, as were the parents. This person was born to be a Congregationalist! One of the earliest memories shared, was of being in a cabin as a very young child and having many children looking down at her. Perhaps this was God speaking to her through this memory.

Being raised in the Congregational church the activities she was involved in began early in her life. She attended Sunday School and Youth group. Also she was in many Christmas programs. She was confirmed after attending Confirmation Classes when she was in eighth grade. At this time she became an Acolyte and this was when the Acolytes had to sit up with the pastor after lighting the candles. (Some times the Acolytes would fall asleep while sitting there.) She has been in Bell Choir since she was 14 years old, taught Sunday School since high school and started serving on the Board of Christian Education in college. She still serves on that board now. She was a member of the Women's Group and helped with bake sales and the Women's Bazaar. She also went with the Women's Group to a "Women of Faith Conference" in Des Moines, which she enjoyed very much.

When Barry and Cheryl Holmes were serving First Congregational Church, she helped with "Girls of Grace" which met at their home. She also was asked, by Barry and Cheryl to be a chaperone for high schoolers at an "Aquire the Fire" concert in Des Moines. That is where she "got on fire" for Christ and to share the Gospel of Christ with youth.

When asked which activity she enjoyed the most, the answer was "Youth Group!" She may be following in her parent's foot steps.

When asked, "Do you have any advice for the future of our church?" The conversation started with a reference to Romans 12:3 through the first part of verse 6. This is where Paul is speaking, " For I say, through the grace given to me, to everyone who is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think, but to think soberly, as God has dealt to each one a measure of faith. 4 For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, 5 so we, being many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. 6 Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, let us use them:.......(NKJV)" The advice being, "We are one body for Christ, therefore Everybody has an active role in the Church and everybody is important!"
