For those of you who read "Pillars of Faith" in August, the person was Al Hays. If you haven't read this article in the church's newsletter and you have a computer, you can find it at this web site: https://www.fccmarshalltown.org/newsletter Thanks, Al, for all you have done, do, and will do!

One of the definitions of a pillar is: a person or thing regarded as reliably providing essential support for something. In the New King James Version of the Bible, Paul writes in Ephesians 2:8-9, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; <u>it is</u> the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." This gift of God is the reason the receivers of this gift want to be the hands and feet of Jesus on earth. So, with these two things in mind, we would like to present the "Pillar of Faith" for September.

A favorite hymn of this month's Pillar of Faith is "It Is Well With My Soul" which starts like this: "When peace like a river attendeth my way, When sorrow like sea billows roll, Whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say, It is well, it is well with my soul."

This person grew up in the First Congregational Church in Mason City, Iowa. This church had a phenomenal heritage of faith and music. It was the home church of Meredith Willson. So it is not surprising that this church had four choirs, Cherub, Elementary, Junior High and Adult. Our Pillar of Faith sang in every one of them and was the accompanist for the Elementary and Junior High choirs.

Next, this person graduated Iowa State with a teaching degree and began teaching 6th grade in Tama County, Iowa in 1972. The initial visit to First Congregational Church of Marshalltown was 50 years ago after the couple's wedding in 1974. They were drawn to this church by the Pillar of Faith's Congregational Heritage. They stayed because of Dr. Shelton, Ernie & Alice Groff and Bob & Helen Emick and the music ministry. The couple sang in the choir beginning with director, Elizabeth Bakehouse.

Our Pillar of Faith and her spouse attended the First International Fellowship of Congregational Churches at King's College in London in 1977. They were in the company of Gary Pierce, Ed and Virginia Adams, Florence Trey, Catherine McGregor, and Vern McGrew. They also became acquainted with Max Strang, John Alexander and David Henry Gray's son. Their culminating worship service at Westminster Abbey was historic. Their Pilgrim Fathers' day trip excursions during the fellowship meetings acquainted them with locations significant in our church history including Scrooby, Gainsborough and Lincoln outside of London. Those same places were significant in the lives of several of her ancestors. The fellowship's point of departure for the entire trip was Leyden, Netherlands from where the Separatists departed eventually on the Mayflower to the New World. She is one of many 10th great granddaughters of William Brewster who was the Spiritual leader for the the Separatists from England to Leyden to the New World. The Congregational Church of the New World begins here.

In the years since that first visit to F. C. C. her children were baptized. She has taught Sunday School, lead Youth Night, directed the Children's Choir and taught Bible School. She served on the Board of Christian Education, Music Committee (formally known as the Music Board) and the Missions and Benevolence Committee (formally known as the Benevolence Board). She was also Church Moderator for two years. She is currently a part of the Women's Ministry group, Bible Study, Chancel Choir, Bell Coir and the Board of Christian Education.

When asked, "What was your favorite activity?" The response was, "My favorite of all opportunities to worship and fellowship at our church is being part of the music. Sharing God's Word through music is a joy. Thank you to all with whom I have been blessed to share my love of music. Thank you especially to Ed Wilcox and Jonna Wagar and my Mason City director, Margaret Peterson, directors extraordinaire!"

When asked, "Do you have any advice for the future of our church?" The response came in the form of a prayer, "My prayer for our church continues to reflect that we be a congregation that serves the Lord with the wisdom to recognize the Holy Spirit as we are led each minute. May prayer be recognized as the priority above all as a vehicle for praise and supplication. May we approach prayer with longing to commune with our Father with delight as opposed to duty. Thank you, Lord, for all that You are. You are our "all in all." And this quote from the Bible, "You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart." Joel 29:13

After seven months of 2024, we are behind budget by 18%.


Below is the Acutal and Budget numbers for our church through July. The Giving includes tithes and offerings. The Buget Expense values are those that have been budgeted through July for the church
