



Board of Christian Ed

Good Morning!

I am Julie Paustian. I am representing the Board of Christian Education. I am here to answer a few questions about the church wide Bible study being considered by the Board of Christian Education.

A little background:

The church Renewal Process participants identified all church fellowship opportunities as a need here at First Congregational Church in Marshalltown.

The Christian Ed Board has the goal of organizing fellowship groups whose purposes are to expand our learning and understanding of God's Word as Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

Support for this effort is found in Scripture.

Fellowship is one of God's primary means of supporting believers.

- 1. Fellowship with Himself
- 2. Fellowship with other believers

Hebrews 10:24-25 encourages believers to meet together to encourage each other in love as they do God's work. Individuals grow in faith as each is uplifted by fellow believers.

Bible study fellowship provides us with strength as we share the power of God's Word. We learn and grow our faith as we share with other believers.

Bible study fellowship is a way of caring for each other.

Hebrews 3:12-13 explains the power in fellowship as a way to encourage and uplift each other day after day which is an essential part of our daily spiritual walk.

Koininia is that term for biblical fellowship which builds unity of spirit as Christians share beliefs, convictions and behaviors in the context of studying God's Word. It produces mutual cooperation in the worship of God. It sets the foundation for cooperation in His will being done in the world.

Biblical fellowship reminds us we are not alone.

Our objective is to glorify God as we share and encourage each other. We respect our weaknesses and our differences. We forgive and find forgiveness as we support each other with truth and love.

Arthur Rouner in <u>The Congregational Way of Life</u> reminds us that "the church itself....every local, gathered church of Christ bears direct responsibility for nurturing, for training, and for raising up its own ministry."

May I point out that we work hard to provide Christian education with God's Word for our youth. Much time and money is spent on our wonderful youth ministry. Some believe strongly that we need similar efforts for our adult education ministry. We as adults need to be strong in faith and God's Word to be the leaders our youth need.

It is the Word of God that defeats the enemy when spoken in faith. Writing God's Word on our hearts leads us to be able to use it as God intended for us to be victorious.

Speaking God's Word brings the Holy Spirit into action. God's Word teaches us how to be fruitful Christians. Jeremiah 29:13 says, "And ye shall seek me and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart." In studying God's Word together, we are seeking Him as He wishes. Studying God's Word with fellow believers equips each of us to be victorious in our daily walk together. It is OUR ministry as a congregation.

Rouner said it well. I repeat his words, "the church itself...every local, gathered church of Christ bears direct responsibility for nurturing, for training, and for raising up its own ministry."

The Board of Christian Education is working to organize a church wide Bible study based on these elements.

In your bulletin there is a simple survey to help us plan. Men and women. This fellowship is for all of us. Your ideas, needs, and participation are essential for our growth as a body of Christ. YOU are essential. Our joy is derived from following the Holy Spirit's directions as we grow in God's Word together.

We would like all surveys returned by December 15 so we may begin processing what you share with us. Let us seek God's Word together as we work side by side! Thank you!

Pillars of Faith @ F. C. C.

For those of you who read "Pillars of Faith" in November, the person was Krystal Randall. One of the definitions of a pillar is: a person or thing regarded as reliably providing essential support for something. The Biblical definition of faith is found in Hebrews 11:1 which says, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Revised Standard Version. Also in the New King James Version of the Bible, Paul writes in Ephesians 2:8-9, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; <u>it is</u> the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." This gift of God is the reason the receivers of this gift want to be the hands and feet of Jesus on earth. So, with these two things in mind, we would like to present the "Pillar of Faith" for December.

Several of the December Pillar of Faith's family in-law had been long-time members, that is where the "church search" began. As it ended up this person looked no further and joined FCC in 1986. So this person has been a member of FCC for 38 years.

After bringing their two young daughters to church for about a year, James Swope, who was on the nominating Committee at the time, asked this person to consider being on the Board of Christian Education. Accepting this opportunity began the journey of delving into the building blocks of FCC. Various memberships were held after that, which included: Board of Deacons, the Benevolence and Missions Committee and helping to plan a few bazaars the church held many moons ago. Being a member of Amity and Women's Fellowship for several years truly helped her develop friendships which continue to this day.

She was the Director of Christian Education for seven years which was under the guidance of the BCE. This included some of her favorite adventures, for example: five day-time VBS days at Isaac Walton League for children Kindergarten through fifth grade and four over night days of Summer Church Camp at Camp Quaker Heights in Eldora for third to eleventh graders with high school seniors as her "helpers".

When she reflects on her thirty years of teaching Sunday School, some of her memorable moments were during "Opening". This was fifteen minutes each Sunday morning when they sang a few songs, (Julie Paustian was their accompanist) shared birthday celebrations and a special message of the day. But her favorite time of the Opening was when the children would share memorable things that happened during their week.

For 20 years, she had the privilege of working with FCC's "Heart Warmer" perpetual calendars. She recalled one order she took over the phone. The gentleman was calling from

England and said he had been "on holiday in Nantucket" (insert a British accent here) and saw a copy of our "Heart Warmer". He placed an order. Oprah Winfery's assistant ordered a copy for Oprah's desk. We received a call from an actress's employee that ordered a copy for his employer and we sent a copy to actress Patricia Neal!

She has wonderful memories of her years playing in the Bell Choir....the practices being her favorite part. "There was WAAAY too much chatting and laughing along with practicing! Thank you for your patience Jonna and Krystal".

Her favorite involvement with FCC was when she was blessed to have been asked to be part of the staff of FCC, which she truly loved for eleven years. She was privileged to have worked with Pastor Greg Ellicey, Barry Holmes and Jean Bower. Many church members enjoyed referring to her as "The Church Lady".

When asked, "Do you have any advice for the future of our church?" her response was, "My wish this Christmas Season is for everyone to have joy, peace and love in their hearts."
