

Pillars of Faith @ F. C. C.

For those of you who read "Pillars of Faith" in August, the person was Debi Estabrook. One of the definitions of a pillar is: a person or thing regarded as reliably providing essential support for something. The Biblical definition of faith is found in Hebrews 11:1 which says, "Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen." Revised Standard Version. Also in the New King James Version of the Bible, Paul writes in Ephesians 2:8-9, "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; <u>it is</u> the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." This gift of God is the reason the receivers of this gift want to be the hands and feet of Jesus on earth. So, with these two things in mind, we would like to present the "Pillar of Faith" for September.

Before I introduce this month's Pillar of faith, this author finds it interesting that the last few Pillars of Faith have originally come from different parts of Iowa and the surrounding area. Maybe it was a job that brought them to Marshalltown but what brought them to First Congregational Church? I believe it is a sense of belonging first to the Triune God, (God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit) which causes one to seek to belong to a like minded community.

However, this month's Pillar of Faith was born in Marshalltown in the early '70s and brought to First Congregational Church as an infant. "My parents were members of this church and I never stopped attending here. I went to Sunday School and when older went to Youth Group. At the time when the Swopes were leading this group. I was confirmed and became a member about 40 years ago.

When I was young my parents were involved in various areas of the church and I helped them. I helped them prepare the elements for Communion and I helped them when they were Fellowship Hosts after the 10:30 A. M. services. We now call this hosting Fellowship time. As an adult I have served on the Board of Trustees for several years. On this board I have met with contractors like painters, plasters, electricians and others in keeping the building in good shape. I have helped to change light bulbs and many other behind the scenes things. My favorite thing to do is running the dishwasher.

My advice for the future of our church is, To fill the pews we need a Contemporary service Plus a Traditional service!"
