

Main Article: Incarnation

There's a story in the Book of Acts, about Paul and Silas visiting a village only to find the people thought they were the gods in disguise. It didn't end well, but it was an example that the ancients believed that the gods sometimes visited mortals in disguise. The events remembered and celebrated at Christmas are more profound. In the Birth of Jesus we have God the Son not visiting the human race in disguise, but rather actually becoming part of the human race. The Creator joined creation. Many parts of the Bible explore this. Here are just a couple of

Philippians 2:5-11

- ⁵ Let this mind be in you which was also in Christ Jesus,
- ⁶ who, being in the form of God, did not consider it robbery to be equal with God,
- ⁷ but made Himself of no reputation, taking the form of a bondservant, *and* coming in the likeness of
- ⁸ And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross.
- ⁹ Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name,
- that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth.
- and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Christ became a servant. Not only did He become part of the human race but he chose the role of a bondservant, a slave by choice. This text tells us that Jesus demonstrated and humble service is the road to true greatness

Hebrews 4:14-16

- ¹⁴ Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession.
- ¹⁵ For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin.
- ¹⁶ Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

We can approach God the Father in prayer because we have a great high priest, but we don't have a great high priest because He is a nice guy. We have one because He knows firsthand all the joys and trials of the human condition. We know this because our King embraced humble service and is now our great high priest all because our Savior entered the human race and was born as a baby so long ago.
